LIONS RACE TO FRESNO

The cross country teams competed in the San Diego Cross Country Championships on Saturday morning at Morely Field. This is the same 3-mile course that Micah Sanchez won the individual CIF Division 5 title on and helped the team to become the Division 5 champs in 2022. Now Coach Danny Sanchez and his runners looked to repeat as champions and qualify for a shot to compete in the state meet in Fresno.

The boys' team is led by Senior Ivan Guzman. Due to graduation and some injuries late in the season, Seniors Joel Bray and Sam Morales, Junior Aiden Burr and Sophomore Caleb Acosta were the only runners

who had experience in the CIF championship races as they were a part of that championship race last year.

Junior Luke Mapes, and Sophomore Marcos Heers rounded out the team for this year's race.

Like their counterpart, the girls' team only had three returning runners with CIF championship race experience. Senior Kylie Pruett, Juniors Haley Svendsen and Noelle Edkins.

Sophomore Cadelyn Belasco, Junior



Keira Hays, Sophomore Amelia Primmer and Senior Walsh Savannah were the remaining runners on a team looking at a chance to qualify for the state meet for the first time in program history. While the girls team ran a solid race, they did not end up qualifying for the state meet. Senior Kylie Pruett and Junior Haley Svendsen were the bright spots for the Lady Lions. Pruett improved her time from last year by 1 minute and 23 seconds, while Svendsen improved by 1 minute and 12 seconds.

During the boys' race, Senior Ivan Guzman stayed toward the front of the pack. After the first mile, he found himself in 4th place and tried to heed Coach Sanchez's advice. "Little by little, close the gap!" Sanchez shouted as Guzman ran by trying to close the gap on the runners in front of him, ultimately ending up in 4th place. Senior Joel Bray was not far behind and began to climb up the leaderboard and finished in 10th and shaved 46 seconds off his time from last year. Senior Sam Morales, Juniors Aiden Burr and Luke Mapes stayed together throughout most of the race and kept the Lion's in contention for a repeat shot at the title. Junior Aiden Burr ran a strong race and improved his race time by 26 seconds. Sophomore Marcos Heers, who had never run cross country before this season, finished the race strong. Heers was in 39th place after the first mile and fought his way to 26th place by the end of the 3-mile course. Sophomore Caleb Acosta had the biggest improvement of the day by finishing the race 1 min and 8 seconds faster than he did last year.

The scoring for the race was the tightest it had been all season. 11 points separated the Lions from a repeat of the Division 5 title. Francis Parker copied the Liberty Charter game plan from last year and won the individual title as well as the team title with a score of 55. Calvin Christian took 2nd with a score of 62 and Coach Sanchez and the Lion's finished in 3rd with a score of 66. These were the 3 strongest teams in the Division 5 race Saturday.

The boys' team will travel up to Fresno and compete in the 2023 CIF State Cross Country Championships. The race will be held on Saturday, November 25th at Woodward Park.
